1 Local Family Support

Develop tailored policies addressing unique needs across multiple life stages following citizens' consultations.



2 Preventive Service Investment

Scale up relationship-based local initiatives that improve long-term well-being while reducing crisis expenditures.



3 Intergenerational Community Building

Promote volunteer programs enabling older adults to support families while reducing isolation. Recognise and support unpaid caregivers.




4 Enhance Living Environment

Address overcrowding, increase green space accessibility, and improve public transport through comprehensive urban and rural planning that creates family-friendly communities.



5 Join Collaborative Networks

Encourage municipalities to join regional networks that facilitate the exchange of best practices, strengthen cooperation, and develop more effective approaches to family support.
