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

Population structure by major age groups and projections, Europe



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

SIP 6 specific actions & deliverables

- 1 Action on prescriptions and adherence at regional level adherence programmes & approaches for chronic disease areas in at least 30 regions
- 2 Personal management of health, starting with initiative on prevention of falls

validated programmes on early diagnosis & prevention of falls in at least 10 EU countries & 15 regions

3. Action for prevention of functional decline & frailty

validated programme starting with preventive tools and measures of risks of older people's malnutrition, reaching >1000 care providers in the EU

4 ■ Replicating and tutoring integrated care for chronic diseases, including remote monitoring, at regional level

by 2015 availability of programmes for chronic conditions in >50 regions, available to >10% of target population

by 2015-2020 based on validated, evidence-based cases, replication/scale-up of proven & effective integrated care models in at least 20 regions in 15 MSs



SIP 6 specific actions & deliverables

5 Promoting innovation for age-friendly and accessible buildings, cities and environments

availability of global standards & validated implementations of interoperable platforms and solutions for independent living

evidence on return on investment of the solutions based on experience in >10 major suppliers, 100 SMEs and 10.000 users

6 Development of interoperable independent living solutions, including guidelines for business models

based on WHO age friendly initiative, a network of major cities/municipalities/regions eager to deploy innovative solutions for age friendly accessible and mobile environments
